NOTICE TO ALL NHP COMMERCIAL SUBSCRIBERS

New Federal Law Allows Enrollment of Dependents Up to Age 26

Dear NHP Member:

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) was signed into law on March 23, 2010. The law includes many new health care related policies that will take effect over the next four years. One of the changes that may directly affect you as one of our members is the new federal policy that mandates coverage for dependents to be raised to age 26.

Since July 1, 2010, NHP has not taken any independent action to disenroll dependent* children prior to their 26th birthday. If you have any dependent children under the age of 26 who are not currently covered and who are not eligible for insurance coverage from their employer, you now have an opportunity to enroll them with Neighborhood Health Plan (NHP).

Dependent children whose coverage ended, or who were denied coverage (or were not eligible for coverage), because the availability of dependent coverage of children ended before attainment of age 26 are now eligible to enroll in Neighborhood Health Plan. You must request enrollment for such children by **December 17, 2010**. Enrollment will be effective January 1, 2010.

* Dependent children include natural and adopted children of the subscriber or the subscriber's spouse, children under the legal guardianship of the subscriber, and children of dependent children.
